



#### SPEAKING UP FOR YOUR SAFETY AND THE SAFETY OF YOUR DRIVER

"AVS" Framework of non-confrontational intervention

- ✓ Acknowledge the dangerous behavior
- ✓ Voice your Feelings
- ✓ Solve the problem by offering a solution.

# ACKNOWLEDGE THE BEHAVIOR IN A FACTUAL NON-EMOTIONAL MANNER IF YOU CAN

- "I see that you are having trouble staying in your lane while texting"
- "I see you are steering with your knees because your hands are full"

### STATE YOUR FEELINGS USING "I" STATEMENTS

Avoid being accusatory ("your driving is ...")

- "I am a little nervous when you text"
- "It scares me when the car goes over the center line"


### SOLVE THE PROBLEM BY OFFERING A SOLUTION


Share Responsibility with the Driver

- "Let me send that text for you"
- "I can answer the phone"
- "We are not in a hurry-pull over so you can use your hands to eat"


#### What will you choose to do when your driver drives distracted?

- ✓ When being driven by a distracted driver ask the driver to drive safer.
- As a passenger share the responsibility for arriving safely with my driver and offer help so my driver does not drive distracted.










# STUDIES HAVE SHOWN THAT TALKING ON A CELL PHONE CREATES RISKS SIMILAR TO DRIVING WITH A .08 BLOOD ALCOHOL LEVEL

- Driving with a blood alcohol level of .08 results in a 4x greater likelihood of being in a crash
- Driving while talking on a cell phone results in a 4x greater likelihood of being in a crash

## WHAT COMBINATION OF LEGISLATION & ENFORCEMENT APPEARS TO WORK?

- Primary enforcement decreased fatalities while secondary enforcement did not
- States with texting laws and primary enforcement were shown to have 3% fewer fatalities than states without texting laws
- Primarily enforced texting laws reduced fatality reductions for younger individuals
- ✓ Texting laws most effective in reducing fatalities for younger individuals, while hand-held bans were most effective in reducing fatalities for adults

### "ANNOUNCEMENT EFFECT"

### Duration of beneficial effects of legislation may be limited without sustained enforcement.

- ✓ Fatal accidents are reduced by texting bans, specifically from 6.3% to 7.5%
- ✓ Reduction in fatalities greatest for the first month following the effective date of the texting ban, approximately 17%, and then decreased so that by the 4th month fatalities had returned to pre-texting ban levels

# LEGISLATION RESULTS IN REDUCTION OF HAND-HELD CELL PHONE USE BUT MAY NOT RESULT IN CRASH REDUCTION

- Drivers in ban states reported higher rates of hands-free phone use and lower overall phone use compared with drivers in nonban states
- ✓ Bans on all phone use by teen drivers have not been shown to reduce their phone use
- Effects of texting bans on rates of drivers' texting are unknown
- ✓ Unclear if bans are reducing crashes

### CALIFORNIA'S HAND-HELD BAN

Comparison of two years prior and two years post California's hand-held ban of July 2008 demonstrates reduction in fatalities and injuries

- Overall declines in fatalities and injuries were, respectively, 22.1% and 12.7%
- ✓ For distracted driving only, the declines were 29.8% for fatalities and 22% for injuries

### **Education and Training Efforts for Parents**

✓ LA – Lack of funding for enforcement, media campaigns and data collection (self reported)

### State Data Collection Efforts - # Data Elements Collected (MMUCC-16)

- External/Passengers/Stereo audio equipment/GPS
- ✓ Communication devices hand –held/hands-free/texting or e-mailing/web browsing
- Eating or drinking/tobacco/reading/grooming
- Computer games/vehicle controls/other
- ✓ LA-6 Cell phone/other electronic/other inside vehicle/other outside vehicle/not distracted/unknown

### **Crash Data Improvement Plans and DD Crash Trends**

✓ LA – "no" and "decreased"

#### **DD Enforcement**

- ✓ Join NHTSA April DD Awareness Month/grants from NHTSA/citations/subpoena records/spotters/SUVs/other laws requiring attentiveness
- ✓ LA uniform patrol

### DD Public Education Efforts and Develop Campaigns w/ Messaging

✓ LA – "yes" and "no"

### **Education and Training Efforts for Parents**

- Develop materials for parents and teens/require DD in Driver's Ed/info on DD in manual/question in license exam
- ✓ LA "no" / "no" / "yes" / "no"

#### Work With Employers to Help Them Develop DD Policies

- Provide sample company policies/conduct workshops for employers/work with NSC/adopt policies for governmental employees
- ✓ LA "no"

### **Research Efforts With Colleges and Universities**

- ✓ Analysis of highway crash data
- Analysis of pre and post hand-held cell phone bans for crashes and cell use
- Attitudinal and behavior surveys
- ✓ LA Analysis of hand-held v. hands-free use while driving and observational and attitudinal surveys hand-held v. hands-free

**Working With Other State Agencies and Private Organizations** 

✓ LA – "yes" LSU

✓ LA – "yes" but vague




### **New Jersey GDL Decal Provision**
